LAUREN BENTON is professor of history, affiliate professor of law, and dean for the humanities at New York University. Her research focuses on the comparative legal history of empires. Recent publications include *A Search for Sovereignty: Law and Geography in European Empires, 1400-1900* (Cambridge University Press, 2010) and *Law and Colonial Cultures: Legal Regimes in World History, 1400-1900* (Cambridge University Press, 2002). In 2003 *Law and Colonial Cultures* won the J. Willard Hurst Prize from the Law and Society Association for the best work in sociolegal history and the World History Association Book Prize for outstanding contribution to the field. Benton received her Ph.D. in history and anthropology from Johns Hopkins University, and her A.B. from Harvard University.
