JOHN BORROWS is a leading scholar and teacher in indigenous, constitutional, and environmental law and has written extensively on aboriginal legal rights, treaties, and religion and the law. A member of Ontario's Chippewas of Nawash First Nation and Anishinabe, he has worked with and for Indigenous peoples in many countries. He has received the Canadian Society of Arts, Humanities, and Sciences fellowship, the Trudeau fellowship for achievement in the humanities and social sciences, and the National Aboriginal Achievement Award.



Professor Borrows completed a J.D. (in 1990), an M.A. in geography and planning, and an LL.M. at the University of Toronto, and a Ph.D. in 1994 at Osgoode Hall Law School. He was a professor and Law Foundation Chair in Aboriginal Justice at the University of Victoria. He taught law and helped initiate the June Callwood Program in Aboriginal Law at the University of Toronto and was the first academic director of the First Nations Legal Studies Program at the University of British Columbia. He founded the Lands, Resources, and Indigenous Governance Program at Osgoode Hall.
