**JUDGE CALABRESI** Professor Emeritus and Professorial Lecturer in Law at Yale Law School, has been a U.S. Circuit Judge since September 1994. He joined Yale Law School in 1959 and was Dean and Sterling Professor, teaching constitutional litigation and torts.

Judge Calabresi received a B.S. degree, summa cum laude, from Yale College in 1953; a B.A. degree, with first-class honors, from Magdalene College, Oxford University, in 1955; an LL.B. degree, magna cum laude, from Yale Law School in 1958; and an M.A. degree in politics, philosophy, and economics from Oxford University in 1959. A Rhodes Scholar and member of Phi Beta Kappa and Order of the Coif, Judge Calabresi served as Note Editor of the Yale Law Journal in 1957-58 and graduated first in his law school class. After graduation, he clerked for Justice Hugo Black of the U.S. Supreme Court.

He has been awarded some 40 honorary degrees from U.S. and overseas universities and is the author of 4 books and more than 100 articles on law and related subjects.

**> GUIDO CALABRESI, U.S. 2ND CIRCUIT JUDGE AND PROFESSORIAL LECTURER IN LAW, YALE LAW SCHOOL**

This annual lecture honors William B. Lockhart, who served as Dean of the University of Minnesota Law School from 1956 until 1972. Instrumental in enriching the Law School curriculum and in attracting highly qualified faculty and students, he also cultivated a strong relationship with the Minnesota Bar, which continues to provide essential support to the Law School. Over the course of his 28 years as a professor at the Law School (1946-1974), Dean Lockhart shared his gifts of excellent teaching and scholarly leadership with students and faculty. Following his retirement at Minnesota, Dean Lockhart taught on the faculty of the University of California, Hastings College of Law, from 1974-1994.
