

This annual lecture honors William B. Lockhart, who served as Dean of the University of Minnesota Law School from 1956 until 1972. Instrumental in enriching the Law School curriculum and in attracting highly qualified faculty and students, he also cultivated a strong relationship with the Minnesota Bar, which continues to provide essential support to the Law School. Over the course of his 28 years as a professor at the Law School (1946-1974), Dean Lockhart shared his gifts of excellent teaching and scholarly leadership with students and faculty.

### HUMAN RIGHTS IN TIME OF TERROR: A JUDICIAL POINT OF VIEW

**AHARON BARAK** was born in Kaunas, Lithuania, and immigrated to Israel in 1947. He studied law at The Hebrew University of Jerusalem where, after completing a term of service in the Israeli Defense Forces, he received his doctorate in law in 1963. Thereafter, he continued his relationship with The Hebrew University, serving as a lecturer, professor, and dean of the Law School.

From 1975 he served as Attorney General of the State of Israel and in this role participated in negotiations that would result in the Camp David Accord. In 1978 he was appointed Justice of the Supreme Court of Israel, where he served in the capacity as President from August 1995 until his retirement in September 2006. He has remained active in academia through his teaching at The Hebrew University and a visiting professorship at Yale Law School. Since the 2007 academic year, he has been a faculty member at the Interdisciplinary Center Herzliya.

In 1975, President Barak was awarded the Israel Prize in jurisprudence by the State of Israel, its highest honor, and was elected to the Israel Academy of Sciences and Humanities. In 2006, he received the international Gruber Prize for Justice for a lifetime of promoting justice and the rule of law. His publications in English include *The Judge in a Democracy* (Princeton, 2008), *Purposive Interpretation in Law* (with Sari Bashi; Princeton, 2007), and *Judicial Discretion* (Yale, 1989).
